The coordinator of CHP Team gave a welcome speech to our guests.

Mrs. Gopa Banerjee gave an introduction to the audience present in the session.

Mrs. Urmi Basu further discussed the following points-

- Importance of women in our society.
- Proper education must be given to the girl child.
- A girl should not be allowed to get married below the age of 18 years.
- A girl should get her independence after a certain age.

- Belief in superstition must be avoided.
- Parents must play an important role in the child's life.
- Religion and caste related problem should be avoided.
- Parents should not allow their child to go out alone.
- One parent should always accompany the child.
- The parents should not leave their child with the neighbours or any unknown person.

Inspector Sarbani Das and Gauri Mukherjee introduced themselves to the audience and discussed the following points:



- If a person faces any kind of domestic violence they should report to the nearest police station.
- If a person faces any kind of problem they should take help from the counselor, District Magistrate, local administrator of the area.
- Lawyers are appointed by the government with minimal charges.
- The complain made by the person in the police station must be appropriate.
- The person should carry his/ her voter ID card.
- Correct address should be given in the police station.
- Some examples were given regarding child trafficking and domestic violence.
- They were very kind and gave the helpline numbers in case of emergency.
